- Print money
- Make rules about trade between states and nations
- Declare war
- Make treaties and deal with foreign countries
- Establish a post office
- Provide an army and a navy
- Make laws that are necessary and proper to carry out its powers
- Spend money for the general welfare
- Make copyright laws to protect authors' writings
- Decide what units of measure we will use

Reserved Powers

- Issue driver's and marriage licenses
- Conduct elections
- Establish local governments
- Make rules about business inside a state
- Use any power the Constitution doesn't give the federal government or deny to the states
- Charter banks and corporations
- Run public schools
- Provide police and emergency services

Concurrent Powers

- Protect public health and safety
- Collect taxes
- Build roads
- Borrow money
- Establish courts
- Make and enforce laws
